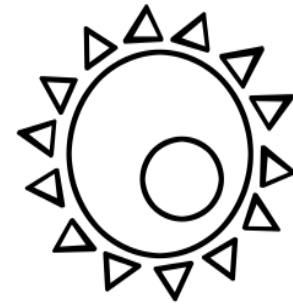

Date: 6/21-6/25 “Ancient Greece”

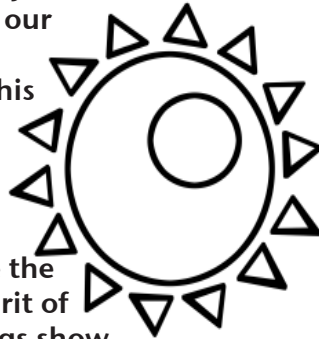
